Saturn-Neptune contacts are important for an artist because they give him the freedom of the group feeling life as a source of inspiration...

A precarious balance usually needs to be maintained so that the collective feelings do not swamp the personality...

The power of any work of art seems to lie in part in its capacity to evoke or constellate the collective psyche, and in acquiring this power the artist must first sacrifice his personality as an isolated unit so that he can become, at least partially, an emissary or transmitter for group feelings.




For me, being an artist isn't just about making nice things or people patting you on the back; it's some kind of communication, a message.



