### ARRIVAL AND REGISTRATION

The entrance to Exeter College is on Turl Street, as indicated on the accompanying map of Oxford. When you arrive at the front gate, you should collect your room key from the Porters' Lodge and you will be directed to the Summer School Registration Desk in the Junior Common Room in order to check in and collect your Summer School folder.

We will be open for registration in the Junior Common Room from **2pm on Friday 19**<sup>th</sup> **August** and **2pm on Sunday 21**<sup>st</sup> **August**.

#### **Late Arrival**

If you know that you will be arriving later than the start time for your course, please let us know in advance. For security purposes, **the entrance to the college is locked at 10pm to anyone without a key**, so we will need to know your estimated time of arrival. An out-of-hours mobile contact number is given below if you are travelling late and need to contact us during your journey.

#### **Additional Accommodation**

#### General

#### **Post**

There is wifi access throughout the college, including bedrooms and communal areas. You will need a personal access code to use this facility and a member of the Faculty team will be able to provide you with one either when you arrive or during your stay. Please ask for an access code at the Faculty Registration Desk in the Junior Common Room.

You may also like to bring an ephemeris with you, or laptop/tablet with astrological software, if you want to be able to check transits etc.

Important: If you have booked for Module 3 or Module 9, you will need to send your birth data (place, date and accurate time of birth) to the Summer School Programme Co-ordinator at <a href="mailto:carole.taylor@astrology.org.uk">carole.taylor@astrology.org.uk</a> (or directly to the course tutors if you are in touch with them) at least two weeks before the course begins. If you do not know your exact time of birth (to within 10 minutes or so), please indicate this.

#### **Additional Activities**

For the five-day courses, Wednesday 24<sup>th</sup> August is a free afternoon for relaxing or exploring Oxford, although there is a workshop scheduled on both Sunday and on Wednesday afternoon if you wish to attend either or both of these. There is an additional charge for the workshops — you can either book in advance or on the day. There will also be a free meditation session with Melanie Reinhart on Wednesday afternoon.

There will be a Gala Dinner on Thursday evening for which you may like to bring something special to wear.

#### TRAVEL TO OXFORD

#### **Cars & Parking**

We would generally advise you not to bring your car to Oxford due to the fact that many of the city centre streets are now closed to traffic and parking is very difficult. There are no parking facilities at the college itself and long-term secure parking facilities in Oxford are limited. Exeter is in the centre of the city, however, and is highly accessible – there is a taxi service from the mainline railway station, as well as buses from the train station to Gloucester Green bus station in the centre of the city, a short walk from the college. In addition, coaches from London, Gatwick and Heathrow airports all stop on the High Street quite close to the college (see below under 'Coaches').

If you do bring your car, it is possible to park briefly in front of the college on Turl Street to unload luggage before driving off to find a parking space. Access to Turl Street is via Broad Street only.

#### **Trains**

The railway station is just off Botley Road on the west side of the city, about 15 minutes walk from Exeter (or 5 minutes by bus to the city centre, then a walk of 5 minutes to Exeter; or 5-10 minutes by taxi direct from the station to the college). Trains run to and from London Paddington and Oxford regularly every day, with a typical journey time of approximately one hour. Direct trains also run regularly between Oxford and Reading, Banbury, Stratford-upon-Avon, Worcester, Birmingham New Street and Southampton, with less frequent services from Brighton, Liverpool, Manchester and Scotland.

The UK train enquiries telephone number is 08457 484950 for information about train services or you can check the National Rail Enquiries website <a href="www.nationalrail.co.uk">www.nationalrail.co.uk</a>. A full taxi and bus service is available as you exit the station, with frequent buses to the city centre.

#### **Coaches**

The nearest stop to Exeter College for all the coach services from London, Gatwick, Heathrow, Luton Airport and Stansted Airport listed below is on the High Street by Queens Lane and the Examination Schools (ask the driver for the 'Queens Lane' stop) and all coaches will stop here before finally terminating at the central Bus Station at Gloucester Green in the city centre.

**From London** – There are two regular coach services to and from London, both of which terminate at Gloucester Green Bus Station in the centre of Oxford. The journey takes about 1 hour 40 minutes from London.

The first is the Oxford Espress (X90) operated by the Oxford Bus Company, which runs at 15-20 minute intervals from Victoria Coach Station and again at 15-20 minute intervals from Oxford back to London (on both Fridays and Sundays). The other is the Oxford Tube service, which runs approximately every 15-20 minutes from Buckingham Palace Road near Victoria Station.

From Gatwick Airport – Either take the Oxford Bus Company's The Airline Bus (X80) which leaves the North and South terminals every hour during the day, or take the train from Gatwick to Reading (which leaves every hour and from where there are frequent trains to Oxford). Both bus and train journeys take between 2 and 2½ hours.

From Heathrow Airport – take the Oxford Bus Company's The Airline Bus. Buses leave Terminal 5 and the Central Bus Station (serving Terminals 1-4) every 30 minutes during the day. The journey takes approximately 1 hour 30 minutes.

Usually, there is no need to book a coach seat in advance, you can simply board the bus and pay the driver. However, it is advisable to check the journey details with the **relevant company before you travel**, plus it is possible to buy advance tickets online.

#### **From Luton Airport**

Catch the National Express Service 737 to Oxford, which runs 8 times a day with an approximate journey time of 1 hour 50 minutes. Coaches leave from Bay 4, 5 or 6 at the front of the terminal building and tickets are available at the nearby Onward Travel Centre. Tickets can also be booked online in advance at:

## **From Stansted Airport**

Catch the National Express Service 737 to Oxford, which runs approximately every 2 hours. The journey takes a minimum of 3 hours and tickets can be purchased at the ticket office in the Arrivals area of the airport, at the coach station or when you board the coach.
